Buhl won 109 games for the Brewers and went 18-6 in Milwaukee's only world championship season, 1957

Haney is the only manager to win a World Series in Milwaukee and won back to back NL pennants here

With virtually no games on TV, Earl was the eyes and ears for Braves fans during the 1950s glory era and was a Milwaukee legend

If Perini doesn't move the Braves here from Boston, we might never have gotten a team
