EXCLUSIVE: Son Of Top Official Of Inner City Advocacy Group Jailed In Connection With Last Week's Hit And Run That Killed Two Children By Mark Belling, WISN-AM

Keisha Robinson, the high profile program director for B.L.O.C Milwaukee, is the mother of the 19-year old man arrested in connection with last week's terrible fatal hit and run accident in which her son is the suspected driver. Her son, the suspected driver, was recently honored as the group's "ambassador of the week."

Two small children have died and a third injured after they were struck by a hit and run driver October 24 at 22nd and Center. Robinson's son, Daetawn Robinson, has been arrested and appeared in court yesterday but has not been charged. Police sources say he is the suspected driver but authorities were given permission to hold him for 72 hours to gather more information to build a case. Police sources say investigators are trying to determine if anyone helped cover up the crash. Court Commissioner Rosa Barillas in open court said Robinson's vehicle was painted and hidden after the crash.

Robinson's mother, Keisha Robinson, is one of the leaders of B.L.O.C Milwaukee, a local organization that has opposed hiring more police and opposes incarceration for reckless drivers. The group has lobbied to spend more money on "prevention."

Daetawn Robinson was featured in a recent Washington Post story on BLOC Milwaukee. The group is a local chapter of an increasingly influential national organization that has pressed for crime prevention programs and opposes more police and incarceration.
