10 11	Section 1.	Chapter 11 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances has been reserved as the Chapter for Health and Welfare related ordinances.

On July 6, 2020, the Dodge County Executive Committee recommended creating certain subchapters in Chapter 11 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances in order to establish certain local health officer duties, authorities, and activities in relation to communicable diseases and human health hazards.

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4. COUNTY. "County" shall mean Dodge County.

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- 5. **DEPARTMENT.** "Department," is the Dodge County Human Services and Health Department.
- 6. HUMAN HEALTH HAZARD. "Human Health Hazard" is defined in Section 254.01, Wis. Stats., as amended, as a substance, activity or condition that is known to have the potential to cause acute or chronic illness, to endanger life, to generate or spread infectious diseases, or otherwise injuriously to affect the health of the public.
- 7. ISOLATION. "Isolation" is defined as the physical separation and confinement
 of an individual or a group of individuals who are diagnosed or reasonable
 believed to be infected with a communicable disease.
- **8.** LOCAL GOVERNING BODY. "Local Governing Body" is defined as a town or village board or city council.
- 9. MASS GATHERING. A "mass gathering" is defined as an assembly of 14 persons at any place or event in Dodge County open to the public at large, 15 whether publicly or privately owned, including but not limited to privately 16 17 owned facilities, parks, libraries, bus stations, technical colleges, theaters, arenas, bars, retail establishments and restaurants. The number of persons 18 assembled constituting a "mass gathering" will be determined based on, 19 20 among other factors, the presence of or the prevention of the specific communicable disease, whether the gathering is indoors or outdoors, the 21 designated occupancy limit of the facility or site and the transmission method 22 and rate of the specific communicable disease. 23
- 10. OWNER. "Owner" shall have the meaning as set forth in Section 254.55(2),
 Wis. Stats., as amended, and shall include an Owner of any property and not
 limited to dwellings.
- 11. LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER. "Local Health Officer" shall mean the Dodge
 County Public Health Officer.
- 12. PERSON. "Person" is defined as an individual, partnership, association, firm,
 company, limited liability company, corporation, society, institution or similar
 entity including owner and occupant.
- **13. QUARANTINE.** "Quarantine" is the physical separation and confinement of
 an individual or group of individuals who may have been exposed to a
 communicable disease, who may or may not have signs or symptoms, to
 prevent or limit the transmission of the disease to non-quarantined individuals.
- 36 **11.06 INSPECTIONS; ENFORCEMENT.**
- 1. Investigation/Inspection. Public Health Officer shall investigate upon a report of the existence of a communicable disease or human health hazard and



may petition the court pursuant to Section 66.0119, Wis. Stats., in the event that entry on the property is refused.

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- 2. Citation authority. The Dodge County Public Health Officer is conferred citation authority pursuant to §66.0113, Wis. Stats.
- 5 3. Except as otherwise provided herein, any person who violates any provision 6 of this Chapter or any order of the County Board issued during a declared 7 emergency or any order of the Dodge County Public Health Officer, as stated 8 herein, is subject to:
 - (a) The issuance of a citation by the Dodge County Public Health Officer or law enforcement officer imposing a forfeiture as provided in Section 30.04 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances in an amount not less than \$250.00 and not more than \$500.00 for each violation.
- 13(b)The commencement of a civil action by summons and complaint and14the entry of a civil judgment for a forfeiture and/or a temporary or15permanent injunction.
- 16 (c) A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on 17 which a violation occurs or noncompliance continues.
- 18(d)Per §252.25, Wis. Stats., any person who willfully violates or obstructs19the execution of any state statute or rule, or any Order issued under this20Chapter and relating to public health, shall be imprisoned for not more21than 30 days or fined not more than \$500 or both.
- (e) Proceeding under any other ordinance or law relating to the same or
 any other matter shall not preclude enforcement under this ordinance.
- 11.07 SEVERABILITY. Should any portion of this Chapter be declared unconstitutional
 or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Chapter shall
 not be affected. It is the intent of the Dodge County Board of Supervisors that all
 sections and provisions of Chapter 11 are independent and, therefore, shall be
 severable from and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Chapter.
- Section 7. Subchapter II of Chapter 11 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances is
 hereby created to read as follows:

32 Subchapter II – Communicable Diseases and Public Health Orders

- 11.08 PUBLIC HEALTH ORDERS; PROHIBITED CONDUCT.
- Local Health Officer; Duties and Authorities. The Dodge County Public
 Health Officer shall have those duties and authorities described in Sections
 251.06 and 252.03, Wis. Stats., as amended from time to time, and DHS
 145.06 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, as amended from time to time,
 and this Chapter.

36	11.09 HUMAN HEALTH HAZARD ABATEMENT.						

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- 1. Purpose and Intent. The existence of human health hazards and certain 1 2 unhealthy, unsanitary and unsafe conditions in Dodge County may adversely 3 impact the public health, safety and general welfare of those who live, work or engage in recreational activities in the County. Abating human health 4 hazards protects the public health, safety and welfare by controlling and 5 preventing the spread of communicable diseases and protects the public 6 7 from unhealthy and unsafe conditions. An Owner shall maintain property free of human health hazards. 8
- 9 2. Prohibited conduct. No Person shall cause, continue, maintain or permit any 10 Human Health Hazard to exist within Dodge County. Any Person who causes, 11 creates, maintains or permits a Human Health Hazard within the County, or 12 who shall in any way aid or contribute to the cause or maintenance thereof, 13 shall be in violation of this Subchapter and liable for all costs and expenses 14 related to the abatement or removal of the Human Health Hazard and for any 15 applicable penalty provided in this Chapter.
- 163.Responsibility of Public Health Officer. The Public Health Officer shall inspect17or cause to be inspected property where a Human Health Hazard is alleged to18exist. A special inspection warrant may be obtained pursuant to Section1966.0119, Wis. Stats., if the Public Health Officer is refused entry to the property20to conduct an inspection.
 - 4. Enforcement.

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- (a) Issuance of Abatement or Removal Orders.
- i. Upon completion of an inspection and the finding of a Human Health Hazard, the Public Health Officer may issue a written order for abatement or removal in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section 254.59, Wis. Stats., which order shall specify the abatement or removal actions required and the time period in which the abatement or removal must be completed.
 - ii. Written orders shall be personally served or served by certified mail, return receipt requested, on the Owner and any occupant.
- Role of Local Governing Body. The Public Health Officer shall forward (b) 31 a copy of all orders to the Local Governing Body having jurisdiction over 32 the property on which the Human Health Hazard is found. If the Human 33 Health Hazard is not abated or removed within the time period specified 34 in the order, the Local Governing Body may enter upon the property for 35 36 the purpose of abatement or removal or cause such other action to be taken as permitted by applicable law for the purpose of abatement or 37 removal. If the Local Governing Body fails to abate or remove the 38 Human Health Hazard, the County may enter the property for the 39 purpose of abatement or removal. 40



- (c) Cost of Abatement or Removal of a Human Health Hazard. The cost of the abatement or removal shall be recovered by the Local Governing Body or the County directly from the Owner or any occupant. If the cost is not paid by the Owner or occupant, a special tax or charge may be imposed on the property as allowed by Section 254.59, Wis. Stats. and pursuant to Section 74.01, Wis. Stats.
- Section 9. Section 30.04 of the Dodge County Code of Ordinances is hereby
 amended as follows:
