

## Brewers Throw 96-Year Old WWII POW Out of Spring Training Game For Failure To Wear Mask

96 year old Norman Jagow of Fredonia winters in the Phoenix area and has attended Milwaukee Brewers spring training games for years. But he was denied admittance to American Family Park in Phoenix last Friday because he wasn't wearing a mask. His family is livid.

Norman was a World War II prisoner of war. He told personnel at the ballpark he is unable to wear a mask because he can't breathe when he has one on. According to his family, he was escorted to the stadium entrance and sent home. His ticket price and parking costs were refunded.

Norman's family said he attended a different team's Arizona spring training game without a mask and wasn't bothered. Brewers spokesman Tyler Barnes [says the team is not making any exceptions to its mandatory mask policy and says if anyone is unwilling or unable to wear a mask, they should stay home.](#)

Norman's son in law tells me the family is disgusted with the treatment given the WWII hero. Most employers and facilities exempt from mask requirements people who have medical conditions. It is unclear if the Brewers will have the same policy when the regular season starts at American Family Field in Milwaukee next week.
