

**EXCLUSIVE: Madison Man Out On \$300 Bail Despite Seven Pending Felony Cases Suspected Of Weekend Murder**

We have yet another case of an individual out on low bail, despite multiple pending cases, accused of committing murder while free on bail.

Authorities in Madison have named Trevon L. Adams as the suspect in a fatal shooting just east side of Madison (Town of Blooming Grove) Sunday. Adams was released only ten days earlier on November 18 on a mere \$300 cash bail after being arrested in connection with fleeing authorities. He was already free on a signature bond in connection with a domestic battery charge in September. He has multiple bail jumping charges for violating the terms of his bail on his earlier cases but was still given the low \$300 bail on the most recent arrest.

Authorities in Madison are piecing together yesterday's Kwik Trip shooting. Adams is in custody and is likely to appear in court Tuesday.

So who's the Madison judge who let Adams skate away on \$300 bail only to see him allegedly kill somebody? His latest bail was actually set by a court commissioner, W. Scott McAndrew. Commissioners are appointed by circuit judges and handle matters like court intake and some bail hearings. The Dane County judges are all extremely liberal and it is very possible any of the actual judges would have also set Adams free on low bail.

This is "bail reform" in action.
