

EXCLUSIVE: Baldwin Refuses To Say How She Will Vote On Referendum Limiting Wisconsin Voting To Citizens

Wisconsin Senator Tammy Baldwin, locked in a tight reelection campaign, is refusing to answer how she will vote on the state Constitutional amendment referendum on the ballot this fall that makes it clear that only US citizens can vote in Wisconsin elections.

On Thursday of last week, I emailed both Baldwin's campaign staff and her US Senate press staff asking how Baldwin will vote on the referendum. Six days later, there has been no response.

Baldwin has been running ads claiming she believes in enforcing the southern border even though she has never bucked the Biden-Harris policies and executive orders that have led to 10-20 million illegal immigrants crossing the border in the past four years. Many Republicans believe the motive for allowing the invasion to occur is to get some of them to vote.

Wisconsin law currently prohibits non-citizens from voting but backers of the referendum want to put the language clearly in the Constitution so that Democrats in the legislature can't change the law. Wisconsin currently does not require individuals to prove citizenship when registering to vote. The only safeguard is that registrants must swear they are legal citizens. Every year a few non-citizens are caught after voting. However, it is very hard to catch because there is no database of US citizens or, obviously, of illegal immigrants. In other words, it's the honor system.

Does Tammy Baldwin want to strengthen Constitutional language to make it clear only citizens can vote? She's not saying.
